

## Meet the Messiah in Sins Domain Through Isaiah's Eyes

Last week we saw from chapters 11-13 three Descriptions of Christ:

1. Messiah – from the stump and root of Jesse a tender plant would grow up without sin, and with perfect judgment.
2. Millennial King – He will create a kingdom like no other and He will be a king worth following.
3. Merciless Retaliator – He will judge the world for its wickedness.

Why is it important that we understand Isaiah 14 is in reference to Lucifer, Satan?

1. Attitude of the Fallen.
  - a. I will ascend into Heaven.
    - i. An improper view of how to get to Heaven.
    - ii. Creating own eternity.
  - b. I will exalt my throne above the stars (all other rulers and powers)
    - i. An improper view of truth.
    - ii. Creating his own reality.
  - c. I will sit also in the mount of the congregation. In Jerusalem where God met with His people.
    - i. An improper view of obtaining a holy position.
    - ii. Creating his own holiness.
  - d. I will ascend above the heights of the clouds. Isaiah 4:5
    - i. An improper view of self.
    - ii. Creating his own sufficiency.
  - e. I will be like the most High. Isaiah 47:8, Genesis 3:5
    - i. An improper view of diety.
    - ii. Creating his own god.
2. Affliction of the Fallen.
  - a. Loss of power. Vs. 5-8
  - b. Loss of life. Vs. 9-11, 15
  - c. Loss of influence. Vs. 16-18
  - d. Loss of eternal life. Vs. 19
  - e. Loss of earthly power. (Directly to Nebuchadnezzar) Vs. 20-23
3. Attention of the Fallen.

- a. Every where but God. Isaiah 9:13
- b. Not to God's word. Isaiah 30: 9 – 10
4. Anticipation of the Fallen.
  - a. Separation Isaiah 59: 2, 12 – 15
5. Aspiration of the Fallen. Isaiah 59:16
  - a. The Messiah became the go between.
  - b. The Messiah brought Salvation.
    - i. Illustration – used to flex for Rachel every time she would touch my arm.
  - c. The Messiah sustains life with His righteousness.
